



Introduction:


 Property owner, John Vogel, has petitioned to annex and rezone the unincorporated property located at 11535 Francis Road.

















Village Board Direction:




Discussion:

Trustee Budzyn asked some general questions about the age of the skidsteer loader and the possibility of fixing it rather than replacing it. Public Works Director Tiberi responded that the skid steer was 20 years old and needs a new electric dash control panel, new fuel injectors and replacement tires, which would cost approximately \$13,500. Trustee Budzyn also had some questions about the wiring and set-up of the police vehicles. Chief Vaccaro went through the slides below showing the detail of the wiring and set up for clarification. The consensus of the Board was to move forward with

budgeting to replace the vehicles recommended in the presentation for the FY 2020 budget.







Trustee Metanias reported on the meeting with the Holiday Inn Express ownership that was conducted earlier that day. He summarized the certain improvements and their completion dates.
